




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7. The Startup Story: Insights from "Sisters Flavors"




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9. Key Traits and Skills of Successful Entrepreneurs

Proposal for LED Clinic



Dipin Karingen CMI, the Associate Director of Rajagiri Viswajyothi College, is excited to introduce an innovative and community-focused initiative: the establishment of an **LED Clinic** on the RVCAS campus. This pioneering project aims to foster sustainability and community support by creating a dedicated space for the collection, repair, and redistribution of broken LED lights.


The primary goal of the LED Clinic is to collect non-functional LED lights from Ward 5 in the Mekkapala region of Vengoor Panchayath. These lights will be repaired by the trained members of the ED Club. The Haritha Karma Sena will then return the refurbished bulbs to the households that originally contributed them. This approach not only supports a circular economy but also offers a valuable community service. To ensure the sustainability of this initiative, a modest fee will be charged for the repair services.

In preparation for this initiative, Fr. Dipin has proposed an insightful field visit to the Thuruthikkara Science Centre. This visit is designed to give interested students and club members a comprehensive understanding of the operational, technical, and community engagement aspects of running an LED Clinic. The specific date for this visit is yet to be finalized, but it promises to be a significant step in bringing this exciting initiative to life. This upcoming project reflects the institution's commitment to innovation, sustainability, and community service, marking a new chapter in the efforts to make a positive impact.
