

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3.4.1 Extension activities are carried out in the neighborhood community, sensitizing students to social issues, for their holistic development, and impact thereof during the last five years

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1. Distriution of Study Materials at Library, Pinavoorkudy

On 17th February 2024, NSS at Rajagiri Viswajyothi college, in collaboration with the Heritage Club and Department of Business Administration has undertaken a meaningfulvisit to Pinavoorkudy Tribal Area at Kuttampuzha Gram Panchayat, in Ernakulam District. The main objective of the visit was to support and engage with the local community, particularly the students of the Lower Primary School in the Kuttampuzha. 45 students participated in the visit. The visit commenced at 10:30 AM and was coordinated by Seena M Peter and Saritha PN. The primary focus of the initiative was twofold: first, to distribute essential books and stationery supplies to the students of the Lower Primary School, and second, to foster cultural engagement through interactive sessions.

During the visit, the BBA students distributed a variety of educational materials, including textbooks, notebooks, and other stationery items, which are crucial for the students' academic growth. This gesture was met with great enthusiasm and appreciation from both the children and their teachers.

In addition to the distribution of materials, the students of Cultural Heritage Club Conducted Some cultural activities aimed at enriching the students' learning experience. This included storytelling sessions, traditional games, and interactive discussions aboutcultural heritage. These activities were designed to not only educate but also entertain, creating a memorable experience for the young learners





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2. Survey on Hepatitis B at Vengoor Panchayat

In May 2024, a Hepatitis B outbreak occurred in the Vengoor, causing a major crisis and leading to the deaths of numerous people. The NSS unit at Rajagiri Viswajyothi College conducted a detailed survey on Hepatitis B in Ward No. 9, Vengoor Panchayat. They visited homes within the panchayat, providing guidance on how to prevent the spread of Hepatitis and advising on steps to protect against the disease.

The initiative, led by NSS coordinator Mrs. Karthika Balachandran, involved 4 students and aimed to assess community awareness about Hepatitis B while promoting preventive strategies. The survey, conducted from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM, covered 52 households. The students focused on gauging residents' knowledge of Hepatitis B, including its transmission, symptoms, and prevention methods. They also provided essential awareness on how to prevent the disease, emphasizing the importance of vaccination and proper sanitation.

The survey findings revealed varying levels of awareness among the residents, with significant gaps in understanding the disease. In response, local health authorities were consulted to offer recommendations for improving public health outcomes. They emphasized the importance of enhanced sanitation practices to reduce the risk of Hepatitis B transmission and the need for widespread vaccination to prevent the spread of the virus.

This initiative not only provided valuable insights into community awareness but also highlighted the importance of continuous education and preventive measures. The collaboration between the students and health authorities serves as a successful model for addressing public health concerns and promoting community well-being. Through this effort, the survey aims to mitigate future outbreaks and contribute to a healthier community.

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3. Snehaveedu -Home for Homeless

The NSS at Rajagiri Viswajyothi College of Arts and Applied Sciences launched a project titled "HOME FOR HOMELESS," aimed at providing shelter and a sense of belonging to those without homes. The NSS team coordinated by Saritha P.N conducted an assessment to identify the needs within the community, focusing on individuals and families living in homelessness or poor conditions. As part of this initiative, two homes were constructed by the team. The first phase of this project began on 30th January ,2023 and its core objective is to build houses for people lacking stable housing.

The NSS unit of Rajagiri Viswajyothi College launched the "Snehaveedu" projectatKoovapady Gram Panchayat on 30th January, 2023 to support individuals without adequate housing. This initiative focused on providing essential aid and building shelters for those in need. Volunteers collaborated with local organizations to identifybeneficiaries and organized activities including site preparation and shelter construction. The project aimed to offer not only physical homes but also emotional support, ensuringa sense of security for the recipients. 15 NSS Students Participated in Construction Project From 14/02/2024. 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4.Dengue Fever Awareness Programme at Ward No. 9 of Vengoor Panchayat



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21. Charity Programme - "Madhu "Mid- Day Meal Scheme

On July 16, 2019, the National Service Scheme (NSS) at Rajagiri Viswajyothi College launched an impactful outreach program " called "Madhu" to assist individuals facing food scarcity. (Mid-Day Meals to Vagrants in places like Kothamangalam. Kurupampady, Rayamangalam, Perumbavoor, Angamaly,etc). Scheduled from 12:30 pm to 01:30 pm, this initiative was designed to provide much-needed nutrition to vagrants and to foster greater community awareness regarding the challenges faced by the homeless. The food prepared in the college canteen is packed by the 14 NSS volunteers in the canteen itself, and they also handle the distribution.

This initiative takes place on the third Friday of every month, with the primary goal of addressing food insecurity and offering support to underprivileged communities Coordinated by Akhil Raju , the program sought toaddress immediate food needs while also engaging the community in social welfare efforts.
