Report on the Event

On December 2nd 2019, the National Service Scheme (NSS) and Drama Club, in collaboration with Vengoor Panchayat, organized an Anti-AIDS Awareness[®] Programme in Vengoor Town. The event occurred at two separate venues, and featured a street play aimed at raising awareness about HIV/AIDS. With a duration of one hour and set at two venues, the programme focused on educating the local population about HIV/AIDS prevention, transmission, and treatment, while also addressing the stigma associated with the disease. The performance, tailored to be both engaging and educational, sought to present complex medical and social information in an accessible and memorable format.



By using relatable characters and realistic situations, the play aimed to demystify HIV/AIDS and provide practical advice on how individuals can protect themselves and others. The interactive nature of the play encouraged audience members to engage in conversations about the stigma, fostering a more understanding and empathetic community environment. The outcomes of the programme were positive and aligned with its objectives. The street-play effectively communicated essential information about HIV/AIDS, and the audience reported a better understanding of preventive measures, treatment options, and the importance of regular testing. Feedback indicated that the play's engaging format made the information more relatable and memorable, contributing to a greater awareness of the disease.

The event included educational materials and brief presentations on the benefits of donating blood, the process involved, and the impact of their contribution. 
Report on the Event



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
daily lives. By incorporating structured reading sessions, the programme sought to inspire a lifelong passion for learning and personal development.

In response to the flooding that severely affected the Paniyeli area, the students of Rajagiri Viswajyothi College of Arts and Applied Sciences organized a flood disaster relief initiative, as the National Service Scheme took the initiative. 
Report on the Event
