## Action Taken Report - 2023-2024

Action Taken Report (Solutions) Based on Observations and recommendations

### Criteria 1 - Curriculum Aspect

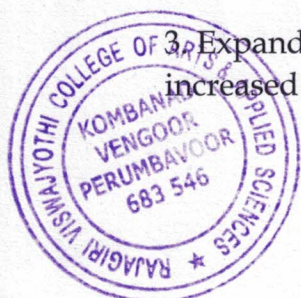
1. Enhance Value-Added Courses: The college increased the number of certificate and value-added courses by 25% and introduced new MOOCs in emerging fields such as AI and data science. Student participation in these courses rose by 30%.
2. Strengthen Industry Collaborations: RVCAS established partnerships with five new industry leaders, leading to the introduction of mandatory internships for all students. Industry-led workshops and seminars have been scheduled every semester.
3. Feedback Mechanism Improvement: An annual report summarizing feedback and actions taken was introduced and shared with stakeholders. This enhanced transparency and showed a 15% increase in stakeholder satisfaction.

### Criteria 2 - Teaching - Learning and Evaluation

1. Expand Experiential Learning: Additional lab-based courses and fieldwork opportunities were added, with a focus on industry-sponsored projects. Faculty integration of real-world challenges increased by 20%.
2. Adopt Advanced Teaching Technologies: AI-driven personalized learning platforms were adopted, resulting in improved student performance metrics and a 10% increase in course completion rates.
3. Strengthen OBE Implementation: Regular workshops were held to assess the OBE system. Learning outcomes and assessment criteria were updated, aligning with industry standards and academic goals.

### Criteria 3 - Research, Innovations, and Extension

1. Boost Research Funding: Faculty applied for and received several national and international grants. Internal seed funding for pilot studies increased by 40%.
2. Promote Interdisciplinary Research: A central research hub was established, facilitating 15 interdisciplinary projects across departments.
3. Expand Extension Programs: Community-based projects aligned with SDGs increased by 30%, enhancing the institution's social impact and student engagement.



#### Criteria 4 – Infrastructure and Learning Resources

1. Upgrade ICT Facilities: All classrooms were equipped with smart boards and high-speed internet. The LMS was updated to include new interactive features.
2. Enhance Library Resources: The digital library was expanded with additional journal subscriptions. Training programs for effective resource utilization were introduced.
3. Improve Sports and Cultural Facilities: New facilities for drama and fine arts were added, and plans for a swimming pool are underway.

#### Criteria 5 – Student Support and Progression

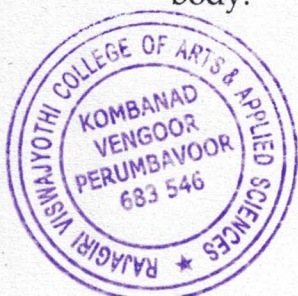
1. Expand Scholarship Opportunities: Partnerships with NGOs and alumni resulted in a 20% increase in scholarship availability.

3. Regular Audits and Reviews: The frequency of internal audits was increased, and peer reviews for administrative processes were introduced, ensuring continuous improvement.

#### Criteria 7 – Institutional Values and Best Practices

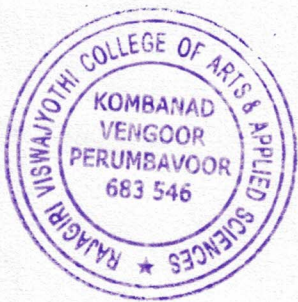
1. Expand Gender Sensitization Programs: Interactive sessions and role-playing were incorporated into gender sensitization efforts, leading to a more engaged student body.
