### Annual Report- 2022-23 Academic Year

The new academic year at Rajagiri Viswajyothi College of Arts & Applied Sciences commenced on 1st June 2022. The institution currently has 249 students across three departments, including 90 first year students

After navigating the challenges posed by the pandemic, the college successfully continued its academic journey. The academic year began with a 15-day internal FDP 'Vidyut 2K22', laying the foundation for the academic activities ahead. The programme featured sessions on academic planning, calendar preparation, and strategies to achieve the college's Vision and Mission. Prominent resource persons, included Fr. Jose Kuriyedath, former Provincial of the Sacred Heart Province, and Fr. Benny Nalkara, Provincial, who conducted sessions on CMI vision of Education for the faculty.

It was a matter of great pride for Rajagiri Viswajyothi to host a wide range of programmes and intercollegiate fests throughout the year.

#### Infrastructure

Rajagiri Viswajyothi College of Arts and Applied Sciences (RVCAS) offers well-organized parking facilities, including designated spaces for student vehicles and accessible parking for individuals with disabilities. The parking area is equipped with security measures like surveillance cameras and ensures smooth traffic flow, reducing congestion during peak hours. This initiative reflects the college's commitment to providing a safe, convenient, and inclusive campus environment for all students and staff.

Rajagiri Viswajyothi College of Arts and Applied Sciences (RVCAS) has introduced a well-equipped Common Staff Room to foster collaboration and provide a comfortable workspace for faculty members. This shared space is designed to facilitate interdepartmental communication, encouraging the exchange of ideas and enhancing teamwork among the teaching staff.

The Common Staff Room is furnished with modern amenities, including workstations, seating areas, and resources for academic planning and research. It provides a conducive environment for faculty to prepare lessons, hold informal meetings, and engage in discussions that contribute to the overall development of the academic community.

#### **Academic Activities**

The academic year 2022-23 began with 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> semester classes commencing on 1st June2022. The pass percentage of individual streams is as follows – This year, the college has a total of 249 students, including 90 first-year students who were admitted to various undergraduate programmes. The overall pass percentage of the sixth semester students of the 2022-23 academic year was 80%.
