

- 'Madhu' Campaign by NSS: The NSS Unit of the college launched a campaign named 'Madhu' to distribute food to the destitute section of the society on the first Friday of every month.
- 3. **Book Donation Campaign**: The Literary Club with the Dept of English undertook the 'Reading Drive and Book Donation Campaign' to provide classes to inmates at two children's homes in the neighborhood and donate books and other study essentials.
- 4. **Food Donation at Snehatheeram Care Home**: The second- and third-year students of BBA donated food (Ona Sadhya) with a group of mentally challenged people at Snehatheeram Care Home, Koovapady.
- 5. **World Suicide Prevention Day observation**: To spread importance about suicide prevention, students distributed ribbons and cards in Kochi Metro and Perumbavoor KSRTC stand premises in association with Mythri, an NGO.
- 6. **Observing International Ozone Day**: Planting of trees and a collective programme was conducted by the NSS on the day, pledging their commitment to environmental protection and conservation of natural resources for a sustainable future.
- 7. **School Adoption programme**: RVCAS in association with the NSS Unit has adopted Govt. LP School, Paniyeli as a social developmental cause and committed itself to contribute towards school's and the student community's growth. This initiative was inaugurated and a series of activities were lined up.
- 8. **Bodhi Memory Walk 2023**: Students of RVCAS joined hands with CUSAT and Govt. of Kerala as volunteers of Bhodhi Memory Walk, 2023 to spread awareness about dementia-free society, as well as participated in the rally and theme dance competition.
- 9. Vengoor TECH TREK: The BCA department-initiated computer classes in Solution with Vengoor Panchayath to empower local residents with essential computer skills. The primary focus was on imparting knowledge about Microsoft office applications and internet usage, aiming to enhance digital literacy and 38

bridging digital divide in technologically driven society.

- 10. **'Varnamayookham'- Street Play- Varnamayookham**: A street play based on the theme of AIDS awareness was performed in several places by the students of Rajagiri Viswajyothi College of Artsand Applied Sciences. The programme was coordinated by the Drama club and NSS.
- 11. **Psychological Aid &Distribution of Hygiene kit**: Students visited the Department of Psychosocial Rehabilitation and Early Intervention Centre of Developing Disabilities, Peace valley Hospital, Nellikuzhi and provided psychological aid to patients in rehabilitations and distributed hygiene kits to inmates.
- 12. **Medical Camp**: Department of English conducted a medical camp for the students of St.Stephen's HSS, Keerampara. The camp included a class on health and hygiene by Ms. Thara Irene George and Dr. Divya Roy, NIMS Hayat Hospital, Nellikuzhy.
- 13. **Junior Fiesta Campus Tour for students:** The Department of Commerce hosted a campus tour for kids from Government L.P School, Mekkapala. Games and activities such as Communicative English class, Paper pen making etc was arranged as part of the tour.
- 14. **Cultural Exchange programme**: The Department of Commerce organized a cultural exchange programme that involved a visit to Government L.P School, Mannamkandam, Idukki. The objective of the event was to connect with the local community and delve into the distinctive cultural aspects of the region.
- 15. **Donated food and Stationaries at Davadan Centre an Orphanage**: The 1st Semester BBA Students celebrated Xmas in Davadan Centre an Orphanage and contributed food and gifts to the members.
- 16. **Blooming Bonds**: Donated food and Christmas gifts with the Specially Abled students- by Department of Commerce. Department hosted a Christmas celebration for Specially Abled students of Ashabhavan Buds, Vengoor.

**Gamification of English Grammar**: The Department of English and the ustualents of II BA English organized a learning- teaching programme at MGM Govt.

HSS, Nayathode where the students of the school were introduced to grammatical concepts through various interactive activities and fun learning methods.

- 18. Snehaveedu Project by NSS: NSS Unit of RVCAS led the noble initiative to build a home for one of our support staff and laid its stone as part of the Snehaveedu Project
- Accelerating Learning and Language Enhancement: The Department of Languages handed over workbooks based on SCERT English textbooks of Class 8 & 9 to the HS Section of MGM High School, Kuruppambady as an initiative for accelerating learning and language enhancement.
- 20. **7 Day NSS Major Camp** 7 Day NSS Camp 'Arpana' was held for the second year NSS volunteers at Government HS, Krariyeli. The volunteers involved in cleaning the school campus, preparing land for farming and cleaning the premises and painting the bus stop at Kombanad junction with graffiti as part of 'Sneharamam' proclaiming the message to protect the oceans and marine life, and other community services.
- 21. Members and teacher in charge of Entrepreneurship Club visited the Kerala Institute for Entrepreneurship Development (KIED) office, Kalamassery as an extension activity, volunteered and interacted with experts in the field.

### **Highlights of Club Activities**

The college provides a conducive environment for students to engage in extra- curricular activities. Clubs are the platforms for the students to become active participants and promote the shaping of skills. Highlights of the activities of few of them are briefed below:

1. **Nature Club-** The club is coordinated by Ms. Anju Antony. The club was instrumental in planning the waste management system in the college. World Environment Day was observed on the opening day of the academic year. The new Waste Management System of segregating wastes for disposal was introduced and a class on composting was given by principal, Dr. Joy P Joseph.

Painting and Crafts clubs- Ms. Dhanya is the coordinator of the club. The club

anchors the decoration works for all events in the college. Trash to Art competition was held to encourage students to develop the skills of recycling. The students of L.P School, Paniyeli visited the exhibition.

- 3. Film Club- Mr. Tennyson Thomas is the club coordinator. 'Oculus'-Photography Competition- Film Club in association with the Cultural Heritage Club organized a photography competition.
- 4. **Cultural Heritage Club-** Ms. Seena M Peter is the faculty coordinator. 'Avega' 2023, the Ethnic Day Celebration was organized by the Cultural Heritage Club. The one-day programme included a variety of events and competitions such as Personality Show- Ethnica and Ethnico, Cultural Fashion Show, cultural programmes. Folk dance competition, bamboo workshop, Kerala Quiz etc were conducted by the club. The Cultural Heritage Club with the Department of Languages organized a visit to the Vengoor Post Office to help students familiarize with the postal department and its functioning. Ist year BBA students and Cultural Heritage Club also organized a visit to a tribal village in Pinavoorkudy, Kuttanpuzha and conducted programmes.
- 5. Drama Club- The club is coordinated by Ms. Anila Roshan Joy. 'Varnamayookham'- a street play based on the theme of AIDS awareness was coordinated by the Drama club and NSS. A skit throwing light on the need to care for elders was performed on World Elder Abuse Day. The Drama Club in association with NSS and SADA Club observed the day through engaging activities and awareness classes to spread awareness on the perils of drug usage. The members of Republic Theatre Group, Perumbavoor performed solo plays highlighting social issues such as dowry system, drug abuse and a musical event. The event was coordinated under the Drama Club of the college.



Music and Dance Club- The clubs are coordinated by Ms. Anna Jain. The club

coordinates the cultural events conducted in the college and dance competitions for inter-collegiate fests.

- 7. Entrepreneurship Development Club- ED Club is coordinated by Ms. Sheemol Chandran. The club conducted a food festival for the commerce fest and had put a snack corner for Deeksharambham. Members and teacher in charge of Entrepreneurship Club visited the Kerala Institute for Entrepreneurship Development (KIED) office. A stationary store named Honesty Heaven Supplies is an initiative of the ED Club which works with the policy of no salesperson but on the honesty of the students and build business acumen in students.
- 8. **Speakers and Debate Club** The Speakers and Debate Club under the mentorship of Ms. Harishma S.L was inaugurated, to provide a platform to discuss and deliberate in any language and to conduct events for students to hone their public speaking and communication skills. The club organized a speech competition on 'If I Were A Teacher' and also conducted a debate and discussion forum on Valentine's Day on 'The Changing Dynamics of Love in Kerala'.
- **9.** Coding Club- The club is coordinated by Ms. Rengini D. BCA Department conducted a programme to raise awareness about Ethical Hacking among students and teachers. Students showcased their creativity and talent through a drama performance centered around cybersecurity themes. The website created for the college by the club was unveiled.
